12 different sessions -participation of approximately 500 + educators





Inclusion

- Inclusion Support Program (ISP): families have ability to access childcare; children are able to participate in a meaningful way, and be supported appropriately in their early learning and childcare facility
- Funding Support Options:
 - Individual Support Model- 53 Individual in ASD-W
 - Shared Support Model- 12 Shared in ASD-W
- Universal Inclusion Support 2022- 50+ facilities requested observation visits for strategies to best support the children with additional needs
- Mandatory Training for Inclusion Support Workers:
 - Benefits of Inclusion in Early Childhood Environments
 - Best Practices for Supporting Transitions in Early Childhood Environments
 - Creating and Implementing a Plan for Children with Additional Support Needs
 - Duty to Accommodate



Early Years Family Navigator

The Purpose for the Position:

- To help families (with children 0-5 years) navigate services and resources to support their children's learning and well-being within their communities
- The role of the EYFN is to promote Early Childhood programs, services and community resources to increase community awareness, educate parents and direct them to access available programs that support their child's learning and well-being.

Current Involvement:

- Access Project -- 4-year-old children identified as being at risk and benefitting from extra supports to prepare for kindergarten
- Kindergarten Registration -- point of contact for schools, FAEC, assist parents navigating the portal
- Creating an extensive resource guide to assist families
- Assisting newcomer families
- Making connections within the community, building relationships, and promoting this new role

Making Friends & Learning Together

- 12 children were registered in the project this year, 9 of whom completed the project from the time of registration to when the program ended.
- 10 facilities participated in the project this year, including one returning facility.
- The feedback from educators has been positive the growth in the children in their care has largely been evident in their social interactions, confidence in abilities, and language development.

Mission and Vision of the Talk With Me Program

All New Brunswick children develop a solid foundation in early language and communication necessary to reach their full potential in school and life.

VISION:

Talk With Me

MISSION:

The Talk with Me Early Language Services offer community-based communication, language and literacy development services that support New Brunswick's youngest children. Talk with Me is designed to build capacity with parents, early childhood professionals and other caring adults in children's lives. Talk with Me provides a continuum of services to ensure the best possible language, communication outcomes for children.



Services

Children birth to 5 years (priority: birth to 3 years of age)

- Offer general information to promote language development
- Support identified at-risk and vulnerable population
 - children referred by Public Health after Healthy Toddler Assessment (HTA)
- Short-term clinical intervention to reduce impact of language and communication difficulties (parent child groups, parent consult/coaching)
- Building capacity with community partners

FAMILY AND EARLY CHILDHOOD WEST (FAEC-West)

- Offers targeted services to families with children aged 0-8 who are at the greatest risk of developmental delays
- Program provides screening and assessment to address developmental concerns in a family centered approach
- Open referral process: parents can self-refer or medical professionals, Social Development and other service providers can refer with parental consent
- Once assigned to an Educator, a Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) is developed in collaboration with the family to set SMART Goals and provide information, activities and support within the scope of services

FAMILY AND EARLY CHILDHOOD WEST (FAEC-West)

- FACE-West currently employs 21 staff members who serve ~225 children each month
- Program Objectives are:
 - 1. Promoting Healthy Child Growth and Development
 - 2. Promoting Positive Parent-Child Interactions & Attachment
 - 3. Improving Family Wellness


FAMILY AND EARLY CHILDHOOD WEST (FAEC-West)

Services include:

- Home Visitation (weekly, bi-weekly or monthly basis)
- Developmental Child Care Services: Placement in an Early Learning Centre, with support as needed, up 12 hrs a week for 25-30 children a month
- Infant Massage
- Circle of Security Parenting Program
- Transition Into Education
- Early Years Direct Assessment (EYE-DA): 1200-1500 children a year, screening and follow up services
- Access to Making Friends Learning Together Project
- Family Support and Community Outreach

Canada-New Brunswick Agreement

Why? Over 500 million dollars in investments to ensure access to high quality, affordable and inclusive Early Learning and Childcare.







