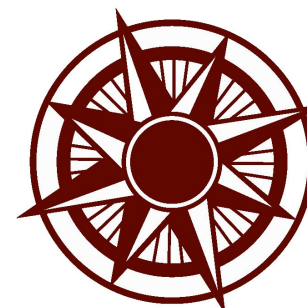

About the Program

Purpose:

The Enterprise Program is for high school students who may be at risk of dropping out or who are not currently attending school.

Students are referred to the program by their zoned high school.

Students earn their high school diploma by working individually at their own pace through the required academic credits.

Schedule:

Enterprise is located in the Fredericton High School building. The Centre follows the same school calendar as ASDW High Schools.

- Morning classes are held Monday-Thursday from 9:00-12:00
- Afternoon classes are held Monday-Thursday from 1:00-4:00

Academics:

The Enterprise Program's curriculum follows the prescribed New Brunswick graduation requirements. Students meet the same curriculum outcomes as those in all provincial high schools.

The program consists of self-paced and self-directed academic programs facilitated by teachers who provide individual instruction and support for students both directly and online.

Referral Process:

Entrance to Enterprise is achieved through a referral process. All referrals are submitted by a member of the Education Support Services Team (ESST) at the student's home school (i.e. school counselor, vice principal).

Upon receipt of a referral, students will be invited to attend an information session.

Referrals are accepted for youth who are registered in an ASDW High School.

Transportation:

It may be the responsibility of the student to find transportation to and from the Centre.

Student Responsibilities:

- Complete all required academic work
- Attend on a daily basis
- Take responsibility for their own learning
- Respect staff, students and themselves

Graduation:

Upon completion of the program, students will receive a regular high school diploma from their respective school and a transcript from Enterprise.

The Enterprise Program is recognized by various colleges and educational institutions throughout the province. Graduates from the Enterprise Program are eligible to apply for post-secondary programs which have an entrance requirement of a high school diploma.

The Enterprise Centre conducts their own graduation ceremony in June.
