Themes

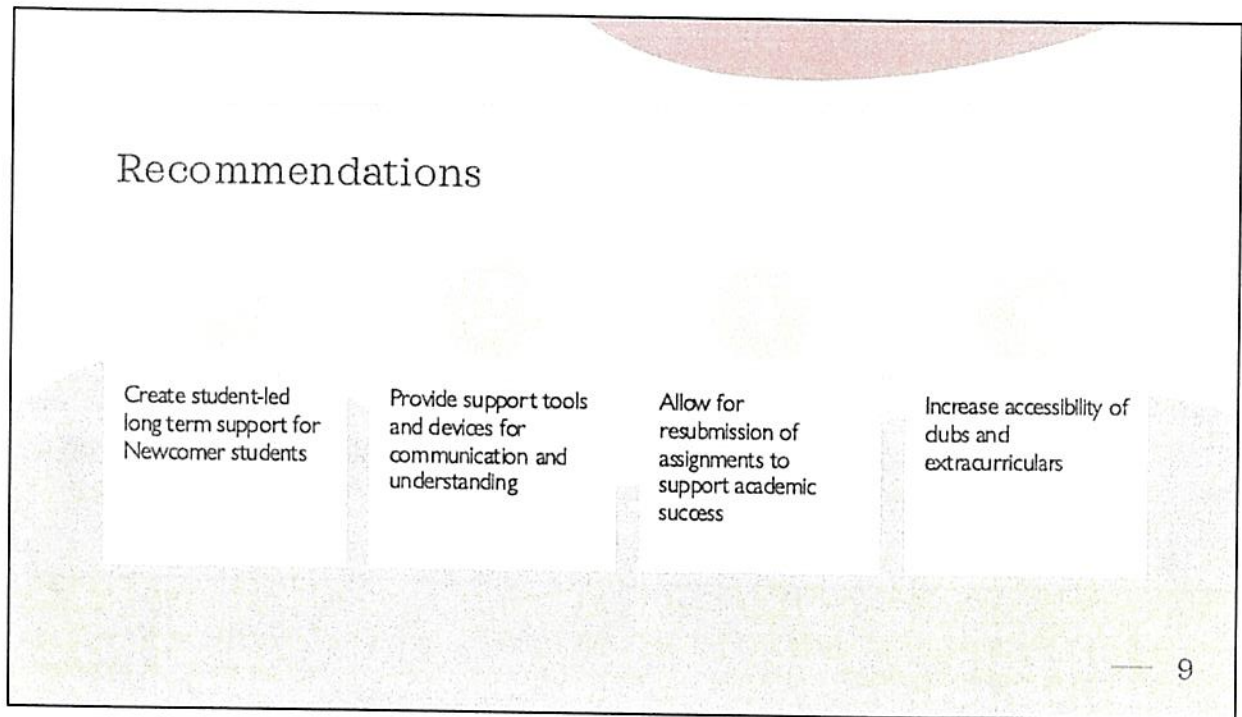


Theme 1: *One-to-one supports and EAL specific classrooms help students thrive in a school environment.*

Theme 2: *Inaccessible extra-curriculars can slow down the social adjustments of Newcomer students.*

Theme 3: *Significant positive change occurs in school engagement, enjoyment, and success over time for Newcomer students.*

Theme 4: *Newcomer students like having a variety of learning strategies available and to choose from.*



Lily: Create student-led long term for Newcomers is proposed to happen in 2 different ways: a micro-course and student leadership groups. Decision based off of focus group data, where many of the newcomers said that they preferred and found it easier to integrate into Canadian schools with the support of their peers. We figured that the micro-course could educate the students on how to best support the newcomers.
